A budget had been established prior to any space planning, design or phasing identification.

And all of this had to be accomplished with P-H in their space which required that disruptions had to be minimized. Balancing freight elevator cab and steel framing restrictions with P-H's functional, design and logistical considerations, we developed a design that allowed many elements to be pre-fabricated offsite and installed with nominal labor, keeping noise, time and cost implications within expectations for all three phases.
